- 3° Inizio del Cantiere di rimboschimento alle Foci di Cagliari che deve essere gestito dalla Camera di Commercio
- 4° Riassetto della scarpata di Via porta Lombarda già finanziato per un importo di 4.000.000
- 5° Immediato inizio da parte dei proprietari terrieri dei lavori di Miglioria in base alla Legge 4/8/1948 per l'occupazione dei Braccianti Agricoli
- 6° Concessione del sussidio straordinario di disoccupazione a tutti i disoccupati involontari in quantità finanziaria raddoppiata dagli anni precedenti
